Overnight in Guesthouse.

DAY 03 - After Breakfast, witness some of the popular pastime games of the Iban folks, visit the burial grounds, trap making and learn about the wonders of the tropical rainforest. Picnic lunch at the waterfall before returning to the longhouse. Afternoon is at leisure. After dinner, see the longhouse activities and go for a night walk before retiring. Overnight in the Guesthouse.

DAY 04 - After breakfast, returning to Kuching. Lunch enroute. Arrive Kuching and check-in at the Riverside Majestic. Day at Leisure and dinner at the hotel.
